



Broadway Rose COVID-19 Safety and Management Plan

2021 Education Programming

In order to keep our campers and staff safe we have developed a communicable disease management plan adhering to guidance from Oregon Health Authority. Broadway Rose will carefully monitor any changes in protocols, recommendations, and guidelines so as to continue providing as safe an environment as possible. Although most requirements and restrictions have been lifted, Broadway Rose will continue to practice caution taking into account mixed vaccination status among students.

Camp Check-In Protocol

Prior to the start of all programs, Broadway Rose will communicate COVID-19 safety measures with parents and request assistance in adhering to the same sanitation and health standards the staff will be upholding. Parents are asked to keep their student home should they experience any symptom associated with COVID-19 (listed on page 3).

Daily check-in will take place outside of the building and caretakers/students will be asked to confirm that:

- no one in the household is experiencing symptoms including but not limited to those listed below
- to the best of their knowledge, they have not been in contact with anyone with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19
- they have not tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks
 - o If the student has tested positive, they must have been cleared as non-contagious by state or local public health authorities before attending camp.

Students and instructors will have their temperature taken and recorded with a non-contact thermometer at the time of check-in. Should their temperature be greater or equal to 100.4F, they will not be permitted to enter the space.

Students and staff will be provided hand sanitizer before entering the space and encouraged to wash their hands regularly.

Exclusion and notification protocols:

Per the Oregon Health Authority, we are required to exclude any student or staff member who tests positive for COVID-19, regardless of vaccination status, from the program.

Broadway Rose will communicate any confirmed cases of COVID-19 within the education programs with the local public health authority and with all families and individuals who have participated in the programs within the last 14 days.

Unvaccinated students should not attend the program if a close contact or member of their household has presumptive or confirmed COVID-19 in the two weeks prior to camp or while camp is in session.

Regardless of vaccination status, students or staff members who are exhibiting or have exhibited any symptoms of COVID-19 (listed on page 3) within the last 10 days should not attend the program.

If students or staff exhibit a cough or fever but test negative for COVID-19, they may return to the program 24 hours after the resolution of cough and fever without the use of fever-reducing medication.

For individuals who are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms but who have received their COVID-19 vaccine within the last three days:

- If the student/staff member has symptoms of fatigue, chills, muscle ache, joint pain, or redness, these are likely vaccine side effects. If no fever is present, the student/staff member may attend the program if they feel well enough to participate. If fever is present, students/staff members should stay home until 24 hours fever-free.
- If the individual's only symptom is fever, they should stay home until 24 hours fever-free. If the fever does not improve in two days, the individual should consider getting tested for COVID-19 as they may have been exposed prior to vaccination.

Symptoms of COVID-19:

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Chills
- New loss of taste or smell
- Fatigue

- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Muscle or body aches

The delta variant of the COVID-19 virus is highly contagious and seems to be presenting with slightly different and much vaguer symptoms than those listed above. Symptoms of the delta variant to be on the lookout for are:

- Runny nose
- Sore throat

Broadway Rose encourages students and staff members to get tested for COVID-19 should they exhibit any of the above symptoms. They should also adhere to the above protocols regarding camp attendance depending on the results of their test.

Vaccination and Masks

Vaccination is not required for participation in our education programs, but we do collect vaccine status information from students in order to help us make safety decisions regarding our programs.

Masks are optional for students who are fully vaccinated and received their second dose two or more weeks prior. Students who are unvaccinated are asked to wear a mask for the duration of camp instruction. Masks will be provided for camper and staff use if needed. If vaccination status among camp participants is mixed, we will maintain a minimum of six feet of distance during the course of class instruction and at check-in/check-out as an added layer of protection against the spread of the COVID-19 virus. If all participants are fully vaccinated, physical distancing may be adjusted depending on instructor comfort level.

Record-Keeping

Broadway Rose staff will keep records of camper names, contact information, responses to the medical waiver, and daily verbal questions and temperature recordings. Broadway Rose will request that should a student or staff member test positive for COVID-19, those results be reported to staff so that we may contact the Washington County Health Authority in order to assist with contact tracing. These logs will also include the drop off/pick up times, parent names, and any staff in the space during camp activities.

Should a camper or staff member become ill during the course of camp or in the two weeks following and test positive for COVID-19 (SARS-CoV-2), we request that that information be shared with Broadway Rose Theatre Company staff. We will then notify

the Washington County Department of Health and Human Services at 503.846.4402 so that contact tracing efforts may begin. In order to assist in these efforts, if requested by the Washington County Department of Health, Broadway Rose may provide staff and student/guardian contact information.

Prior to the start of a camp or class parents are asked to keep their students at home if they are feeling unwell.

Other Safety Measures

All in-person programming has been limited to small groups. Camp sessions do not overlap in order to help minimize the number of people occupying the space each week, however, Broadway Rose staff not associated with the camp will be on site before, during, and after camp.

As an added precaution, Broadway Rose has upgraded all MERV 7 filters in our HVAC system to MERV 13 filters and installed a UV filtration system as well. When possible, doors will be left open to encourage natural airflow and we will utilize fans to aid in ventilation.

Broadway Rose staff will disinfect high-touch surfaces (such as doorknobs and music stands), and high-traffic areas thoroughly before and after every class with bleach cleaners. So as to limit the spaces used by campers and camp staff, we have allocated one bathroom for camper use. The bathroom and water fountain will be cleaned and disinfected between programs and at the end of every day.

Should a camper become ill or be exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 during the course of camp, Broadway Rose will evaluate a course of action up to and including possible cessation of camp activity.
