Jack & the Beanstalk

July 29 – August 1

In addition to putting the best work possible on our stage, to us that also means making it possible for individuals to experience it as fully and comfortably as possible. Below are some advisories for sensory and content sensitive patrons that may contain spoilers for the show.



Audience Participation

There are times when the characters enter and exit the stage through the audience. When Jack talks to Echo, the character that embodies Jack's echo through the clouds, Jack may require the audience's help with responding.



Light Effects

When Jack chops the beanstalk down, lights flash as he hits the beanstalk with an axe.



Loud Noises

There is thunder when the beanstalk grows overnight after Jack's mother throws the magic beans out the window. There is a loud noise that depicts Giant falling from the beanstalk after Jack chops the beanstalk down.



Depiction of Alcohol Consumption

When Cook brings Giant his supper, Giant drinks wine with the supper. *No alcohol is consumed in this production.*



Fantastical Elements

There are characters in *Jack and the Beanstalk* that are fantastical creatures that can talk. Jack's cow named Lucky talks to him before Jack sells Lucky for a handful of magic beans, Jack's echo in the clouds responds back with different words and carries a conversation, and Giant's harp sings. After Jack's mother throws the five magic beans out the window, the beans grow tall enough to reach the land of Giants which is set in the clouds of the sky. The meals that Cook feeds the giant are large animals, like ostrich cutlets, wild buffalo chops, and filet of endangered blue whale.



Emotional Scenes

The Minstrel tell us that Jack's father was killed when Giant rampaged the countryside and stole goods from the people. After Jack's mother sobs about how they do not have money, Jack is told by his mother he needs to go to the market to sell their cow Lucky. Jack does not want to sell Lucky and talks about how he is sad and feels like he is selling a friend. When Jack's mother finds out that Jack sold Lucky for some beans, she gets upset and yells at him for disobeying her. When Jack enters Giant's castle, he hides in order to not be eaten by Giant. When Giant realizes Jack has stolen from him, Giant chases after Jack. Jack chops down the beanstalk and Giant falls to his death.
